1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2. VISION 2026

To position Colombia as a leading esports nation in Latin America through structured athlete development, regulated competition systems, and internationally competitive performance standards.

PILLAR I: ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT & TALENT IDENTIFICATION

4.1 National Esports Academy Program

Objective: Establish 20 affiliated training centers across Colombia.

Program Components:

- Competitive fundamentals training
- Sports ethics and discipline
- Team strategy and communication
- Physical conditioning and ergonomics
- Sports psychology and mental performance
- Digital well-being and anti-doping education

Participants will receive official FEDECOLDE certification (Basic and Advanced Levels).

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4.2 Talent Colombia Esports Program

Goal: Identify 200 high-potential athletes nationwide.

Phases:

1. Online open scouting tournaments
2. Regional qualifiers (on-site)
3. National training camp
4. Official National Ranking System

4.3 Integral Athlete Development Model

- Mental resilience training
- Personal branding and media training

The Gamer Arena will operate as the National High-Performance and Competition Center.

Target Participation: 150 teams
